Sophianum explores South Africa

As part of a cooperation between their school and Daktari Wildlife Orphanage - supported by the Dutch Ministry of Foreign Affairs - a group of students of Sophianum College will work at the center for orphaned wild animals and visit a local school and village during three weeks.
